## **Community Projects**

Throughout the year Greenmount Village Committee have been continuing to work remotely in order to maintain a comfortable and safe environment for our residents. During this time, we have formed strong links with Bury Council and attended Community Collaboration Meetings. It is through this work that the following case studies were submitted.

#### An upgrade to the zebra crossing in Greenmount which is proving to be dangerous

You will notice that we now have flashing LED Belisa beacons, which we hope will help to protect our residents when attempting to cross the road.

#### Increase the accessibility of the footpath joining Belvedere Avenue to Nabbs Way

Work on the footpath joining Belvedere Avenue to Nabbs Way has started but was put on hold due to the second lockdown. This work is being carried out by The Voluntary Rangers, instructed by the council. I am sure that once restrictions are lifted from tier 3 that this work will be allowed to continue.

#### Permission to put more benches on the Kirklees Trail (The Lines)

During the Pandemic many more people are now using the Lines from Greenmount towards Tottington and Bury for their daily exercise. We have been approached by several elderly members of our community who have expressed the need to sit down during their walk. We are therefore proposing to place extra seating along the Lines to help support our resident's health and wellbeing. Funding has been applied for so hopefully we can move forward with this in the New Year.
