Footpath joining Belvedere Avenue to Nabbs Way

Work on clearing the vegetation from the footpath joining Belvedere Avenue to Nabbs Way was completed by council contractors. GVC volunteers then cleared a substantial amount of litter which had accumulated. The footpath is now once again passable and we hope it will be of benefit to residents.

Benches on the Kirklees Trail (The Lines)

Working with the Bury Greenwood Group, under the direction of Bury Council, a number of benches have been installed alongside the footpath, including a 'Happy to Chat' bench. Made and installed by volunteers, the benches are already in daily use. Funding has been obtained from various sources to help provide more benches, the

ongoing Co-op funding campaign will continue until October 2022. (see article overleaf)


We hope more people will be inspired to decorate their own window making Greenmount even brighter this Christmas.
