Significant Funding Wins For Greenmount

Greenmount Primary School Parent Association have received funding from Bury Council for the reusing of school uniforms, called 'PROJECT UNI:CYCLE'

Katie Marsden, PTA Vice-Chair says "We're really excited to get started and the PTA and staff at Greenmount were thrilled to learn that we were one of the chosen charities to be awarded a grant from the Bury Council Climate Action Community Fund to help us do so. The grant will enable us to have a permanent location on the school grounds to collect, sort, store and resell pre-loved school uniform, supporting our community to take positive steps towards tackling climate change.



There is a vast amount of textile waste produced by school uniform and we want to try to stop that problem by recycling as much of it as we can. It's not only beneficial for the planet, but also gives families the opportunity to buy good quality uniform at extremely affordable prices and boosts funds for the PTA charity to boot. It's an all round win-win! Work to open the 'Uni-Cycle' shop begins in the next few weeks."

Greenmount Walking Group / GVC have been awarded funding from the Bury Council 'Let's Do It' Pitch Fund to help develop an outdoor activity hub in north Bury. This money will provide a new information board displaying local walks and also fund an exhibition to promote indoor and outdoor activities in the area. More details to follow.



Finance has also been received from Bury Council's Health Improvement Fund by Greenmount Village Community.

Chairperson Julie Southworth is thrilled with this money, "It will provide a new Wellbeing Trail in Greenmount, starting on the Village Green and

extending around to Island Lodge. An extension to the trail, incorporating the Kirklees Valley LNR Path, a section of which runs from Garside Hey Road to Kirklees Brook, has also recently been improved by Bury Council following my request. A missing link from the bridge to the Lines is the last remaining section and further funds are being sought to complete this."

Bury Greenwood Group, have been awarded a grant from the Bury Council's Climate Action Community

Fund to install solar panels on the 'Barn' to provide enough electricity to meet their needs for lighting and powering light household equipment There are 20 members of the Bury Greenwood Group, including several from Greenmount, who meet in



Philips Park every Thursday morning. It is popularised as a Men's Shed making things out of wood, including the benches which have sprung up in the Village during Covid.

Greenmount Old School has been awarded significant funding from a local charitable foundation to cover much needed extensive renovations to the building including a new kitchen, accessible toilet and security system. Neil Carter, Greenmount URC's secretary said "The funding will continue the improvements and refurbishment to this valued community building."

Holly Mount Orchard also received transformational funding from the same foundation with funds intended to support improvement of facilities and equipment. Volunteer Ian Mayer said "This will secure the Orchard's place in our local community and will provide a major boost to our dedicated volunteers who are conserving this unique heritage orchard for future generations".
